

"Venus" by Kim Radford- A "Walls for Women" grant in partnership with Do More Art (DMA) and funded through the TN Arts Commission. The middle school students from Brown Intermediate School voted to select the winning design, placed in 2021 as the City of Sweetwater's first mural.



The "Sweetwater" mural was done by lettering artist Cymone Wilder in 2021 and updated again in 2024, with funding from SMPOA, Inc.



Sweetwater High School students in the Sweetwater Jr Main Street program were enlisted to select a mural design for the north end of Main Street. This partnered project with DMA led to "Honey Bee Haven" by Whitney Harrington and commemorates the "Sweetest Street in Tennessee" by featuring honey bees.



"Hurrah" by Cincinnati artist Jenny Ustick, went up in 2022 in partnership with DMA and was another finalist in the contest for mural selection in the 2021 round when "Venus" was selected by the students and funded by the Creative Placemaking fund from TN Arts Commission. The mural depicts Febb Burn, mother of Harry T. Burn and her famous and influential letter in Ms. Febb's handwriting, which said "Hurrah and vote for Suffrage". Harry then cast the tiebreaking vote to pass the 19th amendment.



"The Lazy Beagle" by Megan Lingerfelt received funding from the Sweetwater Merchants and Property Owners Association (SMPOA) and the property owners, Sam & Kelly Moser. The mural overlooks the rooftop dining area at the Moser's restaurant, "The Lazy Beagle" and features the TN Tristar and state flower, the Purple Iris.



April 2025 saw the mural "Sweetwater 150th" by Nathan Brown to commemorate the 150th Anniversary of Sweetwater's incorporation as a city. This project is funded in part by a grant from the East Tennessee Foundation's Art Fund and was inspired by presentations on Sweetwater's history from the Sweetwater High School Junior Main Street group.



In the summer of 2022, "Quack Walk" by Ohio-based visual artists Atalie Gagnet and Chase Melendez was added under the overpass along the Duck Park trail.



Artist Tiffany Hargis created the peekaboo mural named "Everbloom". The botanical beauty was completed in April 2025.
